**270/24 Somerset Council Report from Cllr Cavill and Cllr Fothergill**

Cllr Fothergill reported on the following:

Somerset Recycling sites Now Operating on Spring/Summer Hours - All 16 of Somerset Council's recycling sites have reverted to their spring/summer opening schedule on 1 April. Sites will be open from 9am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 9am to 4pm at the weekend. Opening days vary across sites midweek, however all sites are open on a Saturday and Sunday.

Council Tax - Somerset Council is One of Only 6 English Councils to have been given permission for an increase above the 4.99% Council Tax Cap. The £43m budget gap will be bridged using a Capitalisation Direction which is a form of one-off assistance (that was also requested last year) offered by Government which allows the Council to continue to sell off assets or borrow money in order to use the proceeds to fund this years budget gap for day-to-day running costs. The Council also applied to the Government for financial support and whilst it asked for permission for a 22.84% increase in Council Tax, it has been allowed to increase Council Tax by 7.5%. This sees a band D property paying an additional £129 a year. For many homes in Somerset this will be in addition to very large increases in some Town and Parish elements of the Council Tax including an annual increase of £111.73 (Band D) in Bridgwater making it one of the most expensive in the country.

New and increased car parking charges - Somerset Council announced their intention to introduce a new parking policy that will see residents across the county pay more for parking. At the Executive Meeting on 3 March it resolved to

- Expand Sunday charges covering the whole county.
- New on-street parking charges – e.g. parking bays

Following considerable challenge it was decided to not proceed with new overnight charges.

So what happens next - these proposals have been supported by the Councils Executive and they are all now subject to a formal consultation process. The public 6 week statutory consultation will then follow, possibly commencing in mid to late May. This will be followed by a review of the responses to determine whether they can proceed as planned or whether changes, including mitigations are needed. The decision will then be made as to whether to proceed or not. The final decision will then be made by the Executive possibly during August or September – dates yet to be confirmed.

Formal review into the local government and electoral arrangements for Langport and Huish Episcopi - The Community Governance Review (CGR) has been triggered following a valid petition from people living in both existing local council areas, calling for the current local councils to be dissolved in favour of a single parish, in the interests of efficiency and cost effectiveness. The review will start by consulting key stakeholders. Issues that will be considered as part of the review include the number of new councillors for the new parish council and whether it should be divided into wards. Final recommendations are due to be considered by Somerset Council this autumn, with implementation of the decision to be effective from April 2027. Taunton's Paul Street will be closed for 2 days for important upgrades - The library, and The Glass Box innovation space, will close their doors on Wednesday and Thursday 9 and 10 April for a major IT network and Wi-Fi hardware and systems improvements.

The library will reopen at 9.30am on Friday 11 April.

Dog Control Order Currently out for Consultation – Somerset South Dog Fouling and Somerset South Dog Exclusion Ninesprings - The Council is proposing to extend two existing orders; the first relates to a dog exclusion zone in part of the Ninesprings Park in Yeovil while the second covers dog fouling and keeping dogs on leads in public places across the former South Somerset District Council area.

The existing Public Space Protection Orders (PSPOs) are due to expire, and the Council is seeking the public's views on extending the orders for a further three years.

The PSPO relating to Ninesprings covers the lower lake area and would bar people from taking dogs into the zone. Assistance dogs are exempt. The area is rich in wildlife and the order aims to protect the habitat.

The second PSPO relating to dog fouling and keeping dogs on leads aims to protect the public and local wildlife. The consultations run until 5 May 2025 and can be accessed via the following links:

A family Feedback Survey on digital Social Care Records – closes April 2025 A Digital Social Care Record (DSCR) is the digital recording of care information and care received by your relative, from their care provider, replacing traditional paper records. This is sometimes called an electronic care plan, electronic care record or electronic care management. This allows everyone involved in a person's care to see appropriate information to help with that care.

The Digitising Social Care Records initiative is being managed by NHS England

Somerset School Nurse Feedback – closes May 2025 Feedback will be used to better understand how we serve you well, where we might need to improve and what you value most from our service.

Cllr Cavill reported on the following:

Protection of wildlife orders have been put in place to either require that dogs are kept on leads or to keep dogs off certain areas. Orders like these could be considered for the Country Park / Sports Pitches.

School places – a 7 place primary school will be provided at Wilstock at a cost of £7.7m. Representatives at the meeting confirmed that alternatives to building new secondary schools are being considered to settle demand for secondary school places.

## **271/24 Planning**

### **a) To consider any planning applications (listed on the Somerset Council website)**

Cllr Cavill, as a member of the Somerset West Planning Committee did not take part in discussions of the planning applications to avoid fettering his discretion.

48/25/0014: Erection of a first floor extension to the side of 51 St Quintin Park, Bathpool.

The Parish Council supports the granting of permission.

48/25/0016/T: Application to carry out management works to two ash trees and one field maple included in Taunton Deane Borough (West Monkton No.1) Tree Preservation Order 2001 to the rear of 62 Mead Way, Monkton Heathfield (TD897).

The Parish Council supports the granting of permission and made the following comments in respect of the proposal:

The Parish Council suggests felling the two ash trees if ash die back is present and suggests that the ash trees are replaced with appropriate trees that have limited height growth to ensure that the landscaping screen remains between the property and Monkton Heathfield Road.

38/19/0129: Phased development of 292 no. dwellings with associated access, infrastructure, open space (formal and informal), landscaping and related works on land off Lyngford Lane, Taunton (additional information submitted).

Clerk to register Cllr Haskins to speak at the Somerset Council Planning Committee meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> April when the application is being considered again.

48/25/0005: Conversion of loft into ancillary accommodation with raising of roof and extension and erection of detached double garage, with home office above, at 134 Bridgwater Road, Bathpool (amendments to application including change to the style of the roof, external materials, amendments to the fenestration including one window in either side elevation that will be fitted with obscure glazing and restrictive openers).

The Parish Council supports the granting of permission.

**b) To note that Planning decisions made are available on Somerset Council website filed under the application number**  
Noted.

## **272/24 Assets**

### **a) BACH; Solar panels update, gifting of projector to WM Scout Group**

Cllr Gage provides an update on the solar panel project. The main holdup is regarding the ongoing ownership of the panels once they are installed. Confirmation of the position of the Primary School / Diocese is awaited. Cllr Gage has requested that the decision of the primary school / diocese is confirmed by 17<sup>th</sup> April. The hold up means that installation can not take place during the Easter School holidays, if a decision is confirmed by 17<sup>th</sup> April it may be possible to install them in the late May school holidays. Clerk to add an item to the agenda for the next meeting. Cllr Gage also raised the PC projector that is no longer used and the request from the West Monkton Scout Group to borrow it. It was agreed to gift the projector to the Scout Group as the PC no longer has a use for it.

### **b) Country Park; barriers for events**

The need for barriers at the Country Park for when events take place was discussed and options considered. It was noted that the required planning permission for the items at the Country Park included in the lottery application has now been obtained which includes a fenced disabled parking area. It was agreed to make the fencing for the car parking area more substantial and in the short term and for the VE Day event, use vehicles to create a barrier between the parking area and the rest of the site.

Clerk to gather quotes for fencing as soon as possible for consideration.

Candy Sully, Volunteer Coordinator provided an update on work to install the WW2 memorial.

Cllr Gage confirmed that the ride-on lawnmower is being collected by Bridgwater Mowers for a service on 9<sup>th</sup> April.

Cllr Haskins to cut the community events area using a collecting ride on lawn mower in preparation for VE Day.

The drainage cover was discussed. Cllrs Cavill and Haskins to action the repair.

## **273/24 Projects**

**a) MH1 POS; Feedback from catch up meetings with Persimmon. Approval of Managing Agent. Transfer document update / approval**

Clerk provided feedback from the catch up meetings with Persimmon. The Play park remedials are underway. 60% of the tree works have taken place – bird nesting evident so remainder will be done later. The final version of the transfer and plan are awaited.

A meeting of the Working Group took place on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> April during which the quotes received from two Managing Agents who have expressed an interest in become the Managing Agents for the Management Company were discussed. One of the Managing Agents were in attendance.

Members of the Working Group provided feedback on the quotes and the meeting and recommended that the quote / proposal from Saxons be accepted and that Saxons are appointed as the Managing Agents for the Management Company. It was resolved to appoint Saxons as the Managing Agents initially for one year. Proposed by Cllr Gage, seconded by Cllr Chapman and agreed with all in favour.

Clerk confirmed that as soon as the final transfer document and plan are received, the Working Group would meet to review the documents with a view to recommendations being made to the Parish Council.

*Cllr Cavill left the meeting.*

**b) MH2 Update; Feedback from meeting with CSM PC on 24th March 2025 and agree next steps.**

Clerk provided feedback on the MH2 meeting with CSM PC on 24th March. During the meeting concerns were raised regarding lack of progress, viability / lack of transparency, CIL allocation / use by Somerset Council, the mechanism for delivery of infrastructure from CIL receipts, phosphate changes and ongoing concerns about the highway proposals. It was agreed that a letter would be drafted to be sent to Somerset Council Lead Member for Planning, Cllr Rigby. A draft letter was circulated in advance of the meeting and discussed. Subject to one amendment, regarding the viability assessment the letter was approved.

Clerk confirmed that the next steps are for a zoom meeting to be requested with Simon Fox, the Planning Officer, and the letter to then be sent.

In addition FOI requests to be made to Somerset Council regarding CIL receipts and planned expenditure and school places.

*Cllr Cavill rejoined the meeting.*

**c) Waterleaze Football Pitch update**

Clerk provided an update on the Waterleaze Football Pitch. Clerk and Cllr Cavill met with Cllr Frascini from the Town Council to discuss progress. Parking for the pitch is an issue. It was suggested during the meeting that an approach is made to David Wilson Homes about the land to the West of Maidenbrook Lane to provide some informal parking for the Country Park and Pitch and to extend the Country Park. It was agreed that the Clerk approach David Wilson Homes.

If land for parking isn't identified the next option is to consider reconfiguring the site to provide a small section of parking only. Consultation with residents of Waterleaze would need to take place when developing any proposals for the pitch.

The pitch and the adjacent play park was still owned by the Developer and handover to Somerset Council is awaited.

**d) Poppy of Honour update; storage between events.**

Cllr Cronshaw provided an update on the Poppy of Honour and its preparation for being taken to the planned events. The Poppy of Honour Committee have stated that they would like to attend the events to provide support when the events take place at the weekend.

The schedule for the events was shared on the screen and Cllrs committed to towing / attending the events.

Clerk requested a copy of the insurance certificate for the Poppy of Honour that confirms that there is adequate cover for the Poppy whilst it is in transit.

Cllr Cronshaw asked if the information to satisfy the planning condition for the Poppy of Honour pavilion has been supplied to the Planning Authority – Clerk to check. This will inform the groundworks required. Cllr Cronshaw can then make approaches to companies who may sponsor the groundworks.

Cllr Cronshaw provided an update on catering for the 6<sup>th</sup> September event. It was agreed to schedule a meeting after VE Day to discuss arrangements and plans for the event.

Storage for the Poppy of Honour were discussed and a few places identified as possibilities.

**274/24 Reports, including recent developments, matters to consider and decisions to be made:**

**a) Bathpool Flood Warden: Mr Kevin Perry.**

Mr Perry reported on the following:

Despite a period of dry weather the attenuation pond is retaining water and isn't draining – this is likely to be due to lack of maintenance and the ditch that it drains into being overgrown. Cllr Cavill to chase enquiries about ownership of the attenuation pond to confirm responsibilities for its maintenance.
